Presentation

The current global food crisis has highlighted the extreme vulnerability of developing country populations to fluctuations in food prices and supplies. Most recently this has been exacerbated by the financial and economic crisis. The international community has attempted to tackle this complex set of challenges in various ways. UNIDO, in line with its mandate, is responding by increasing its efforts towards strengthening agribusiness value chains, expanding developing countries' food supplies and their access to markets, technology and investment.

In order to provide an opportunity to share innovative solutions to agribusiness problems and promote networking and matchmaking, UNIDO is organizing an international conference in cooperation with the Government of Egypt and the SEKEM Initiative. The conference is supported by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), and co-financed by the Italian Development Cooperation and the Swiss State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO), as well as by private sponsors.

Innovative conference approach

The conference aims at inspiring new approaches to interactions throughout the agribusiness value chain by sharing innovative agribusiness solutions and best practices that can potentially be scaled up and/or transferred to other countries or regions. The conference will:

- Present a large number of **innovative agribusiness solutions and best practices** which have proved to be successful and can serve as models. Rather than generic presentations on problems and needs assessment, viable solutions will be demonstrated through case studies.
- Provide **opportunities for matchmaking and networking** between those participants who are seeking ways to achieve sustainable agribusiness development and those with innovative solutions, as well as those with financing for development assistance and investment.
- Allow participants to **observe applied solutions first-hand** and exchange experiences and views in an informal environment, as the first day of the conference will be held on SEKEM Farm, located outside Cairo, which won the Right Livelihood Award widely known as the "Alternative Nobel Prize" in 2003.
- Bring together some **300 participants from over 60 countries** - from farms and agro-industries, from producers associations and NGOs, from public and private technical and financial institutions, from governments, international organizations, donors, and academia.
- Follow-up on the successful "**Global Agro-Industries Forum - Improving Competitiveness and Development Impact**" organized by UNIDO, FAO, IFAD and the Government of India in New Delhi, 8-11 April 2008.
- Feature **interactive panel discussions in Davos format**. The opening session will be moderated by Todd Benjamin, contributing financial editor for CNN International.

Success story

The inspiration for the conference was the success achieved by the UNIDO project “Traceability of agro-industrial products for the European market”, funded under the Italian-Egyptian Debt for Development Swap. The project established an effective traceability system for exports to the EU, which has enabled Egyptian farmers and the food industry to increase food safety and

overcome technical barriers to trade, thus facilitating the sustainable access of Egyptian food products to export markets. The project assisted about 100 of the 200 packing houses in the country, and it is estimated that these account for over 70 per cent of exports. Through them, the project has reached around 45,000 farms and thus nearly 5 million people.

Preparation and follow-up

Conference preparations are being supported by an International Advisory Board and by a Technical Committee, which is responsible for reviewing the solutions submitted and selecting those with the greatest potential as models for sustainable agribusiness development.

In order to sustain the results of the conference and to promote South-South cooperation, a platform will be initiated to continue the identification and dissemination of **successful agribusiness solutions**.

Conference Topics

The conference will focus on innovative agribusiness solutions that can serve as models for development in the following four areas.

- 1 Supply/value chains, market access and linkages.** Farmers, especially small farmers, and SMEs need viable business solutions to be able to participate in a sustainable manner in the food industry supply/value chain. Transaction-based mechanisms must be developed to fill gaps along the chain in order to facilitate market access for these farmers and food processors and link producers with buyers.
- 2 Compliance with standards and conformity assessment.** Agribusiness actors must comply with standards, technical regulations and conformity assessment procedures throughout the supply chain, including private standards and SPS measures, in order to overcome barriers to trade. Greater compliance will increase the quality and safety of food, protect consumers in both developing and developed countries and increase access to domestic, regional and global markets.
- 3 Technology and value addition.** Food producers in developing countries need to progress from producing and exporting commodities to adding value and increasing quality, safety and productivity through sustainable processing and manufacturing. Such changes also contribute to domestic food security by reducing post-harvest crop losses.
- 4 Innovative forms of financing.** The development of domestic farms, enterprises and suppliers and strengthening of agribusiness related infrastructure requires innovative forms of financing to support technical cooperation, business development and investment.
